What do you remember about science at school?

"I really liked Science lessons at school and although I don't remember a lot about primary school science lessons I remember studying flowers and looking for bugs in the garden and field at school, and a lesson on magnetic fields where I got the iron filings stuck to a very strong magnet by mistake! Mostly I remember my Science lessons at high school, learning about plants and cells and loving learning about how things work."

What is your favourite aspect of science and why?

"My favourite aspect of Science now is the human body, and how all of our different body systems work together – it's all very clever!"

How is science involved in your job?

"Science is the basis of everything we do as a Nurse. Every medicine, every operation, every dressing or care that we provide for our patients is based on proven evidence that it works. I work in the operating theatres at the Hospital helping the doctors that operate on patients who are not well, so Science is in the operations that we do, the tools that we use and especially in the robot that we have in our hospital that helps us to do some very tricky operations. Because of Science, our patients get better quicker and can go home sooner."

Why would you recommend your job as a future occupation for children at our school?

"I love being a Nurse, and one of the best things about Nursing is that there are so many different types of Nurse that you can be. Some Nurses help babies into the world, some look after old people, some care for patients having operations or who are very poorly in hospital and some look after people in their own homes. Every day can be different, and every one of my patients is different. We look after people when they are frightened and scared, and try to make them feel better."
