## Let's look at the story



The football programme, Match of the Day, was without a presenter last weekend as the main presenter, Gary Lineker, had a disagreement with the show's producers, the BBC.

The BBC expressed it was unhappy with some of his recent public social media posts. The comments he shared criticised the Government's new immigration plans. A few days later, the BBC apologised for the episode and said that Gary Lineker would be back to presenting. It also announced an 'independent review into its social media usage guidelines'.

## Why was Gary Lineker taken off air?

Gary Lineker tweeted criticism of the language used by some politicians in the Government. He said that the words used were similar to those 'used by Germany in the 30s'. Lineker refers to a time when the Nazi Party were in power in Germany. The BBC said it considered the presenter's 'recent social media activity to be a breach of our guidelines'.

## What do people think?

Some people believe that Gary Lineker should be allowed to say whatever he chooses, particularly as the topic of immigration is something that is very important to him. On the other hand, others - including government politicians - feel that the language he used was not appropriate. The BBC says it has told Gary that, 'He should keep well away from taking sides on party political issues or political controversies'. However, the corporation reiterated that it never said Gary should not be allowed to share his opinions, or that he can't have a view on issues that matter to him.

## What is the new government policy ?

Last week, the UK government announced a new plan to stop people, who arrive in the UK illegally, from being able to claim asylum and be given permission to stay. This has been done because of a significant increase in the number of people making the dangerous journey across the English Channel in small boats. If it becomes law, the bill will give the Home Secretary greater powers to send people arriving illegally back home, or to a safe country. It would also make it easier to prosecute people smugglers. However, many charities, other politicians and public figures, including Gary Lineker, disagree with these policies.

## What have people said about the new policy?
