**Vocabulary**

sculpture	A piece of art in 3D form
Harp	A musical instrument with strings that are plucked
Slavery	When people or a person, are made to do work for another person, without being paid and without having basic human rights.
Plaster	A material made by mixing a powder with water, which sets hard when dried.
Exhibition	An organised display of items such as pieces of art, for people to come to see
Art gallery	A place where art exhibitions take place
