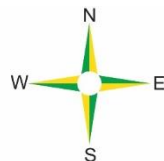
Geographical skills and fieldwork

 Recognising key features of coastal locations on photographs and maps.

**Vocabulary**

Seaside	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort.
Coast	The part of the land adjoining or near the sea.
Beach	A pebbly or sandy shore, especially by the sea between high- and low-water marks.
Cliff	A steep rock face, especially at the edge of the sea.
Harbour	A place on the coast where ships may moor in shelter, especially one protected from rough water by piers, jetties, and other artificial structures.
Lighthouse	A tower or other structure containing a beacon light to warn or guide ships at sea.
Map	A diagrammatic representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc
Island	A piece of land surrounded by water.

**What will I find out?**

- Use compass directions – north, south, east and west to say where something is in relation to something else.



- Locate human and physical features on a map.
- Follow a map to get somewhere.
- Use the language of direction and position – behind, next to, in front of, past, further on.
