For many countries, Pride Month is celebrated in June as that was the month when the Stonewall riots took place. The Stonewall riots were important protests that took place in 1969 in the USA. They are thought by many to have led to significant changes in equal rights laws for a lot of countries around the world. Celebrations include: parades, parties and workshops. In some parts of the world, it is recognised at different times of the year.

Pride is a celebration of people coming together in love and friendship, to show how far rights for people in all types of relationships and communities have come, and how in some places, there's still work to be done.

Romania

Bucharest, in Romania, hosts one of the country's biggest Pride celebrations, and many of its events are dedicated to education and outreach. From community meetings to exhibitions, debates, and conferences, the events at Bucharest Pride are more educational and a contrast to some of the parades and parties in other countries.

United States

New York City hosts one of the largest Pride celebrations in the world, with events across the entire month. The biggest event is the NYC Pride March.

During the month, many buildings are lit up with rainbow lights and many musicians perform in concerts.

Thailand

Pride 1999 saw Thailand's first Pride Week in Phuket. The event has grown a lot since then. Most of the activities take place on Thailand's beaches each year in April, and include beauty contests, beach volleyball tournaments, and cabaret shows.

European cities

EuroPride, hosted in a different European city each year, is a huge celebration involving street parties, family fairs, city tours and live music - open to people from all around the world.

Do you believe that recognising Pride as we do is a good way to do this? Can you think of any other ways?
