Week three of the Spring Term:

We have been thinking about the journeys made by refugees this week in worship, using Mary and Joseph's exile to Egypt as our starting point. We heard how King Herod plotted to kill all baby boys to try to get rid of the baby Jesus, making it too dangerous for his parents to stay in Jerusalem. We then thought about modern-day refugees and the hardship they will have faced, when leaving their own homes and going somewhere new. From this we began to think about how we can be more welcoming to people who visit our school. Our children shared some wonderful ideas to make visitors feel welcome, "You can say hi and ask what their name is. You can make them feel more welcome by giving them a nice smile as well," suggested one of our Y6 children.

We have begun to start our acts of worship with different ways of saying hello and good morning. You may be aware that we use Makaton to sign 'good morning', but thanks to one of our children who speaks Ukrainian, we have been practising the greeting 'привіт всім' (preevyet vsim) each day (while still using our Makaton signs!)

Meanwhile, our Reception class went on a hunt around school this week, to look for gingerbread people, who had been into their classroom without permission! They were confident they had seen the culprits, and from various descriptions from the children themselves, they were looking for a fast, fat, invisible gingerbread man. Cherry Tree Library Visits
