What do you do if you feel down, sad and or lonely?

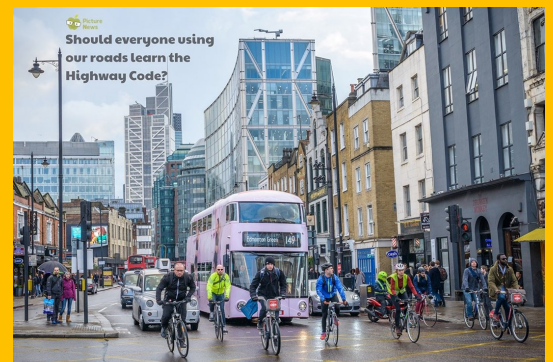
Is there anyone we can pray for?
